# **Guidelines for Submitting Project Form to TDF Foundation**

- Every project must fill out the form and submit all relevant documents that will help TDF Foundation to make the decision of the approval.
- There are two types of projects, a) Individual projects. b) TDF projects
- Individual projects are taken up by any individual and can use TDF Foundation for sending necessary funds to target organization that is responsible for actual implementation/execution of the project.
- All projects have to satisfy some conditions to be eligible for using TDF Foundation services for their project. They are:
  - The project should be non-profit in nature. In other words, the project should aim to help people in general and without any profit motive. TDF uses IRS rules for determining if a project is non-profit in nature.
  - The target organization that actually receives funds should have a non-profit status from the government of the country in which it operates. It is the responsibility of the applicant to provide necessary documentation that proves the non-profit status of the receiving organization.
  - Some institutions are recognized as non-profit by its nature and no further document is needed by these institutions to prove their non-profit status. Some examples of such institutions that are non-profit are: a) Public schools, b) Village/city municipalities, c) Government hospitals.
  - If the target organization is not in US, then the organization should have permission to receive money from foreign countries.
  - The target organization that receives funds should not be list of organizations that US Government considers not eligible for receiving funds from US.
- TDF charges 2% towards administrative expenses for sending funds to target organization. However, if the applicant happens to be a member of TDF, he is eligible for 10% discount on the administration charges. In other words, TDF members only pay 1.80% to TDF for administrative charges.
- TDF projects are projects that are taken up by either TDF itself, or projects that are initiated by individual TDF members and supported, in part or full by TDF.
- The decision of TDF Foundation is final for accepting a project application.
